DAVID ASHBY MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP FUND IN ARCHITECTURE was established and endowed by David's sister, Ms. Dianne Ashby, in accordance with his wishes, and to create a perpetual tribute to David (B.ARCH 1981, M.ARCH 1984). The income from this fund supports students of the Illinois School of Architecture who have been selected to participate in the study abroad program in Barcelona, Spain.

WILLIAM B. BAUHS MEMORIAL FUND IN ARCHITECTURE was established by Mrs. Mary Joanne Bauhs and her children, family, colleagues, and friends to honor her husband, William B. Bauhs (B.ARCH 1965). This fund provides support for students participating in study abroad programs, with preference to the China program.

E. BENNO PHILIPPSON AIA TRAVELING AWARD IN ARCHITECTURE (BSAS 1961, M.ARCH 1962) was established in 1996 to provide supplemental funding for an architecture student participating in a study abroad program to make site visits to a key building or monument which he/she would not have otherwise been able to see firsthand.

CHARLES CLEMENS COUNCELL MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIPS are funds established in memory of Mr. Councill (BSAE 1922). Mr. Councill was an architectural engineer with the U.S. Government in Washington, DC, where he designed many federal buildings and participated in the 1949-52 renovation of the White House. After retirement, Mr. Councill spent two years touring Europe and, upon his return, published a book of his architectural sketches. The fund helps to underwrite the cost of study for students accepted to the study abroad program in Barcelona, Spain.

FRANK B. AND JENNIE M. LONG TRAVELING AWARDS provide stipends and funds toward travel expenses to enable architecture students to undertake studies that require two to three months of summer travel.

RAYMOND A. PIGOZZI MEMORIAL AWARD was established by his family and the O'Donnell, Wicklund, Pigozzi & Peterson (OWP/P) Foundation in memory of Mr. Pigozzi. Raymond Pigozzi (B.ARCH 1951) was a founding partner of OWP/P in Chicago, which is now OWP/P Canon Design. Mr. Pigozzi's professional career was devoted to educational architecture. He was appointed a Fellow in the AIA in 1982. This award is given to students who will be participating in international studies programs.

ALL STUDENTS

Illinois for Illinois (I4I)

- Available to all Illinois undergraduates
- Awarded in three categories:
 - General Merit
 - Financial Need
 - Underrepresented
- Non-traditional locations receive some special consideration
- Winners determined by quality of essay responses

Financial Aid

- Amount of financial aid for study abroad depends on your individual financial aid package
- Consult financial aid advisor in the Office of Student Financial Aid (OSFA)
Take a copy of program budget (official or unofficial) to OSFA

International Programs (IIP)

- Available to all Illinois undergraduates
- Funded by donations from Illinois alumni and friends
- Criteria varies:
 - some have specific criteria for programs and destinations
 - some have open criteria for variety of applicants and programs

Writing Your Scholarship Essays

- The National and International Scholarships Program (NIS) can assist in revising applications for regionally or nationally competitive scholarships
- Consult the Writers Workshop on campus and/or ask a peer to review your work

SOME STUDENTS

Provider Scholarships

- For students participating on provider programs (sponsored through that provider)
- Can offset the cost of a provider program

Gilman Scholarship

- Open to students who are U.S. Citizens receiving a Pell Grant
- Grant program sponsored by the Institute for International Education (IIE)
- Awards of up to \$5,000
